**Rug Hooking 1**

Primitive rug hooking is a fascinating and versatile craft! It's an excellent medium for recycling woolens into art pieces or functional floor coverings. Students will draw a simple design on a piece of prepared burlap, cut 1/4" strips of recycled wool fabric, and learn to use a special rug hook to pull the loops through the burlap to create a looped pile on an 8" x 8" sampler piece. Start on Thurs. and finish on your own. Approximately 4-6 hours is needed to complete a project. All materials supplied.

**Shaker Tape Seat Weaving 1**

Weave a seat on a small foot stool using two colors of shaker tape. Choose from 2 stool sizes and several weaving patterns. All materials provided.

100+ years ago, creative people adapted an ancient textile art, twining, to make rag rugs. At least 4 additional hours outside class will be needed to twine a 24" by 22" rag rug on a frame type loom. **Wooden Yo-yo 1**

Students will make a yo-yo from native woods such as walnut, cherry, cedar, sycamore or sassafras, then ply a string to complete the project. All materials supplied.

**Beginning Chip Carving 1**

Number of sessions 1

This intro class will focus on learning the technique of Chip Carving. Because the knife is razor sharp, we will go over safety and technique for the first 15 minutes, followed by a brief 'show and tell' of what can be done using the chip carving technique. For the last hour and a half, the students will try chip carving on a scrap of wood, then when comfortable with the techniques, start the project of either a Christmas tree ornament or a cup coaster.

The class cost will cover the knives and the hand safety equipment to borrow, the scrap wood, the final project wood to keep, and a number of designs to choose from.

If there are folks that also attended the first class and want to take the second session also, I can provide more challenging project options and help with more advanced techniques.
